

"Among respondents identifying as part of the exclusionist community, 17% approve of the term queer, and 3.7% specify queer as their preferred umbrella term...with LGBT (no additional letters or symbols) being preferred by 54.8% of exclusionists."

Other findings:

"Among respondents who consider themselves members of the LGBT[...]+, queer, mogai, or similar communities, 75.1% approve of the term queer, and 38.7% specify queer as their preferred umbrella term. Queer was the most preferred umbrella term among LGBT[...] + respondents."

"Among trans or nonbinary respondents, 75.6% approve of the term queer, and 41.6% specify queer as their preferred umbrella term. "

"Among genderqueer respondents, 88% approve of the term queer, and 54.8% specify queer as their preferred umbrella term."


"Among a-spectra respondents, 84.9% approve of the term queer, and 47.8% specify queer as their preferred umbrella term."

Here's a reminder. Philadelphia's new addition of the late Gilbert Baker's Rainbow Pride Flag. It was designed in protest because of the exclusion and white supremacist violence against black people in Philadelphia's gay bars. The flag is not meant to replace Baker's vision, but rather to coexist with the larger movement to fight for LGBTIQ+ People of Color. It is the reality that our people are still being targeted and brutalized by white supremacists, not just by homophobes and transphobes.

This new banner was actually displayed on the other side of the world in East Timor's first ever Pride Celebration the very same year when this flag was introduced in Philadelphia USA. Many other LGBTIQ+ communities of color followed across the world. Gilbert Baker would have been very proud. He saw a dozen revisions of his flag during his lifetime and he welcomed the creation of Michael Page's Bisexual Pride Flag and Monica Helm's Transgender Pride Flag in the 1990's.

Also you must include the Victory Over AIDS Rainbow Flag in this. It has a black stripe attached below the rainbow. It is dedicated to the thousands of LGBTIQ+ people who fell victim to the HIV and AIDS Epidemic.

It was declared that once we finally found a cure for the disease, all black stripes must be removed from below the respective Victory Over AIDS Rainbow Flags, and

Racism (white supremacy) and colorism in our communities have become rampant, even serophobia which is hatred towards people infected by sexually transmitted diseases, especially HIV. These need to be addressed. That is what these Pride Flags are meant for.
